It's the sort of money you don't miss, the coppers and silver that hangs around in trouser pockets or in the bottom of handbags – it's never enough to buy anything, it just weighs you down and clutters up your life. But if each of us fills a jar with that spare change, together we can make a real difference."*

Exploring Northumberland

HospiceCare North Northumberland is a nurse led community service with developing partnerships working with the Primary Health Care Teams, Social Services, hospitals and other voluntary organisations. There are a range of services available which are tailored and delivered to meet the needs of the individual and their families. HospiceCare offers support, friendship, empathy, and a safe place to talk about fears and hopes for the future. This issue, our focus on **Lymphoedema Care**.

Lymphoedema is a chronic condition which occurs due to a failure in the lymphatic system allowing excess fluid to accumulate in the tissues of the body. The lymphatic system is part of the immune system and also helps to maintain fluid balance. Swelling can occur anywhere in the body, for example the limbs, trunk, head and neck or genital area.

Lymphoedema is not curable but we can help to treat it successfully. Patients are given information on prevention and management of their condition and are regularly reviewed within the clinics. HospiceCare's service gives patients a programme of care and advice which can include skin care, self-massage and exercise.

Some patients require compression garments or more intensive treatment involving a course of specialist massage and/or bandaging to reduce the swelling. Any swelling can cause considerable physical and psychological distress; therefore an important part of the service involves listening to and discussing the patient's worries and concerns.

Patients who develop swelling can be assessed and their care shared with the community teams.
